INTEGRATING THEORY AND PRAXIS IN THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION

24 - 25 AUGUST 2020 AT FORUM WIEDENEST/GERMANY (NEAR COLOGNE)

This conference wants to bring together scholars from a variety of disciplines related to the Christian faith and to theology to reflect on issues pertinent to the relation and the integration of "theory" and "practice" in academic research, writing and teaching.

The convener of the conference is GBFE, a network for research and higher education in Europe in collaboration with the University of South Africa. In 2020 GBFE and Unisa will celebrate 20 years of fruitful partnership. Issues and topics such as the contextuality of theology, empirical research and empirical theology, as well as the proper relation of action and reflection have been at the core of these 20 years of collaboration.

We think it is time to reflect critically and constructively on these topics and we invite academics related to the GBFE-Unisa network, as well as specialists (in one of the areas identified below) from outside GBFE/Unisa who can bring insights from the current academic discussion to the table.

The conference shall address fundamental and critical issues with regard to methodologies in theological studies and by doing so, sharpen the vision and the focus of GBFE's contribution to theological studies for the years ahead.

Presenters are asked to address topics pertinent to one of the following issues:

- Bridging the gap between the praxis of faith and theological theory through research and teaching in theology. Critical reflections on ideals, achievements and failures.
- Understanding theology as "practical science" (Handlungswissenschaft). Reflections on epistemological and methodological issues.
- Research and reflection across the borders of disciplines (interdisciplinary studies). This includes both opportunities and challenges.
- The role of the Bible and the Christian tradition in contextual theologies. This include issues of normativity and relativity.
- The opportunities and or challenges of doing theology missionally and contextually.

The conference will include a number of plenaries as well as group sessions devoted to the different disciplines (Biblical Studies, Systematic Theology, Practical Theology, Missiology, as well as other areas of theology-related studies such as Development Studies, Leadership or Counselling).
